Chabot scored a game-high 28 in the Jr. Huskies 100-78 win over the Edmonton Hoopsters Friday night. Williams added 23 points.

Clint Unsworth of Maple Creek had a game-high 20 points as the Saskatoon Jr. Huskies were victorious over the Edmonton Grads Saturday afternoon, 81-44. Williams finished with 14.

Williams led the Jr. Huskies with 21 points in their 72-62 win Saturday night over the Grande Prairie Wolves.

The Huskies maintained their PDC winning streak, winning the championship final 76-65 over the Calgary Jr. Dinos. The 17-and-under squad has won the tournament title all four years, and has never lost a game in the four-year history of the PDC. The Jr. Huskies led 37-30 at halftime. Chabot had a game-high 19 points, while Williams added 15 for the Jr. Huskies. Tinashe Mutswanga added 10. Steve Trinidad and Colin Haggarty led the Jr. Dinos with 11 points each.
